Between 1962 and 2005, I have given 260 academic presentations at universities and research academies, at professional conferences in many countries in Europe (U.S. A., U.K., Belgium, the Netherlands, France, Germany, Sweden, Finland, Italy, The Check Republic, Hungary) and in Asia (Japan, China, Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, the Philippines, Indonesia, Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, Viet Nam, Nepal, India) plus Australia , New Zealand, also at the United Nations and The World Bank. *For 1982-2002, I served as the President of the American Committee on Asian Economic Studies, an inter-university program for research in U.S.-Asia economic relations.*

Between 2000-2004, for my research on the current project, I have served as a Visiting Scholar with Japan's Ministry of Finance in Tokyo, the Central Bank of the Netherlands in Amsterdam, Banque de France in Paris, Der Deutsche Bundesbank in Frankfurt; Peking University in China; Bologna Center of the SAIS-JHU at the Bologna University, Italy, As a Fulbright Senior Specialist, in 2002 in India I lectured at various universities in Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, New Delhi, Hyderabad in India; and in 2003 at universities in Wellington, Dunedin, Christchurch, Hamilton and Auckland in New Zealand. I have also visited European Central Bank (ECB) in Frankfurt in 2000 and 2002 and each visit included personal conferences with ECB's Chief Economist, Dr. Otmar Issing. On January 8th 2005, at a session at the annual meetings of the American Economic association in Philadelphia, I presented a paper on the same subject as stated in this proposal. The paper will be published in 2005.

I have testified before the specific sub-committees of (a) the U.S. House of Representatives, (b) The United States Senate, (c) The White House Economic Conference. I have also testified before the U.S. Civil Rights Commission. (all published in their proceedings). I served for four years as a member of the 1980 decennial census committee for the Asian Americans and was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation by the U.S. Bureau of The Census. I testified before the Federal Inter-agency Commission on exclusive classification of the Americans for the administration of the Civil Rights Law. In recognition of "The outstanding contribution to the American Way and Pride in their Ethnic Heritage.." on September 21, 1986, I was awarded THE HONORED AMERICAN AWARD by President Reagan.
